Pursuant to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) as amended by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) and the National Contingency Plan, 40 CFR Part 300.820, Fort Riley announces the publication of the Proposed Plan for the Final Remedial Action at the Pesticide Storage Facility (PSF) site.

The Proposed Plan is being provided to inform the public of Fort Riley's recommendation for No Further Action at this site. The Proposed Plan contains project information, including a description of the site, the contaminants found, removal actions taken, and the rationale for the No Further Action recommendation. The recommendation has been developed in coordination with the Environmental Protection Agency, Region VII, and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. Changes to the plan may be made if public comments or additional data indicate that such a change will result in a more appropriate remedial action.

The Pesticide Storage Facility is located in the Public Works maintenance and equipment storage yard and was formerly used as a mixing and washdown area for pesticide application equipment. In 1994 Fort Riley performed a Removal Action in which approximately 2700 tons of contaminated soil was excavated and disposed of off-site.

The National Contingency Plan requires a 30-day public review period after the publication of Notice of Availability. The Proposed Plan is available for viewing at the Directorate of Environment and Safety, Building 407 Pershing Court, Main Post, Fort Riley, telephone 785-239-8662. Copies will also be available for viewing at the Dorothy Bramlage Public Library, Junction City, Kansas; the Manhattan Public Library, Manhattan, Kansas, and the Clay Center Carnegie Library, Clay Center, Kansas. Copies of other project documentation, including the Remedial Investigation reports, are also available at these locations. A limited number of the PSF Proposed Plan will also be available for distribution at the above libraries, at the Availability Session, or may be requested from the Fort Riley Directorate of Environment and Safety, (785) 239-8662 or the Fort Riley Public Affairs Office, Building 405, (785) 239-3032.
