Enclosed are six sheets describing strains which I think will be of use to other workers. The strains are being sent under separate cover. The two pcon^c strains are included in both the Normal Sequence version and the translocated version. They are not interest in our hands and the sequence there is complete exclusion of double crossingover, hence I am sending both. Both forms are necessary for preparing diploids, and therefore I think that both belong in the collection. The same general goes for preg^c alleles. The rationale for sending two alleles of pho-2 is that one of them is useful because it makes none of the enzyme at all; the other is useful because unlike the "tight" one, one can isolate revertants and suppressors of it.
