Dear Bill:

Enclosed are six sheets describing strains which I think will be of use to other workers. The strains are being sent under separate cover. The two  $pcon^C$  strains are included in both the Normal Sequence version and the translocated version. They are not ~~interconvertible~~ obtainable from one another by recombination, at least in our hands, since there is complete exclusion of double crossingover, hence I am sending both. Both forms are necessary for preparing diploids, and therefore I think that both belong in the collection. The same ~~gene~~ goes for  $preg^C$  alleles. The rationale for sending two alleles of  $pho-2$  is that one of them is useful because it makes none of the enzyme at all; the other is useful because unlike the "tight" one, one can isolate revertants and suppressors of it.
